This second edition of the GAP is chaired by Professor Joongi Kim and Professor Maxi Scherer. Their support and guidance have been key to the design and success of this publication and builds on the earlier work of Professor Maxi Scherer and the late Professor David D. Caron as Co-Chairs of the first edition of the GAP.

Professor Joongi KIM is Professor of Law at Yonsei Law School in Seoul, Korea. He has been a visiting professor at ESADE, Georgetown, Keio, the National University of Singapore, National Law School of India University (Bangalore), University of Florida and University of Hong Kong.

Professor Maxi SCHERER is Special Counsel at Wilmer Cutler Pickering Hale and Dorr LLP, holds the Chair for International Arbitration, Dispute Resolution and Energy Law at Queen Mary, University of London, and serves on the Delos Board of Advisors. She has extensive experience with arbitral practice both in civil and common law systems, having represented clients, provided expert opinions and sat as arbitrator in more than 100 commercial and investor-state arbitrations. She has been regularly ranked by Chambers Global, Who's Who Legal, BestLawyers, The Legal 500 etc. as leading arbitration practitioner, including in the highest category of "Global Elite Thought Leader".
